2017 Master Plan New Project Development Program

- CPRA Accepted Proposals for New Projects to be Included in the 2017 Coastal Master Plan
- Deadline was August 21, 2014
 - ~ 130 Project Ideas Submitted
 - ~ 25 Project Sponsors Including Agencies, Parishes, Elected Officials, Landowners, etc.
 - Variety of Project Ideas Submitted including Bank Stabilization, DiversiOns, Hydrologic Restoration, Marsh Creation, Oyster Barrier Reef, Ridge Restoration, Shoreline Protection, and Structural Protection

2017 Master Plan New Project Development Program

- New Round of Submittals due October 31, 2014
- Same Criteria as Initial Round
 - New projects can be proposed:
 - That build and/or sustain land, through project types identified in the 2012 Coastal Master Plan
 - That provide significant Flood Risk Reduction, through structural or non-structural projects
 - In response to radical shifts in the coastal landscape, resulting from hurricanes or other disasters that have occurred since the 2012 Coastal Master Plan
 - That address future uncertainty challenges, such as climate change

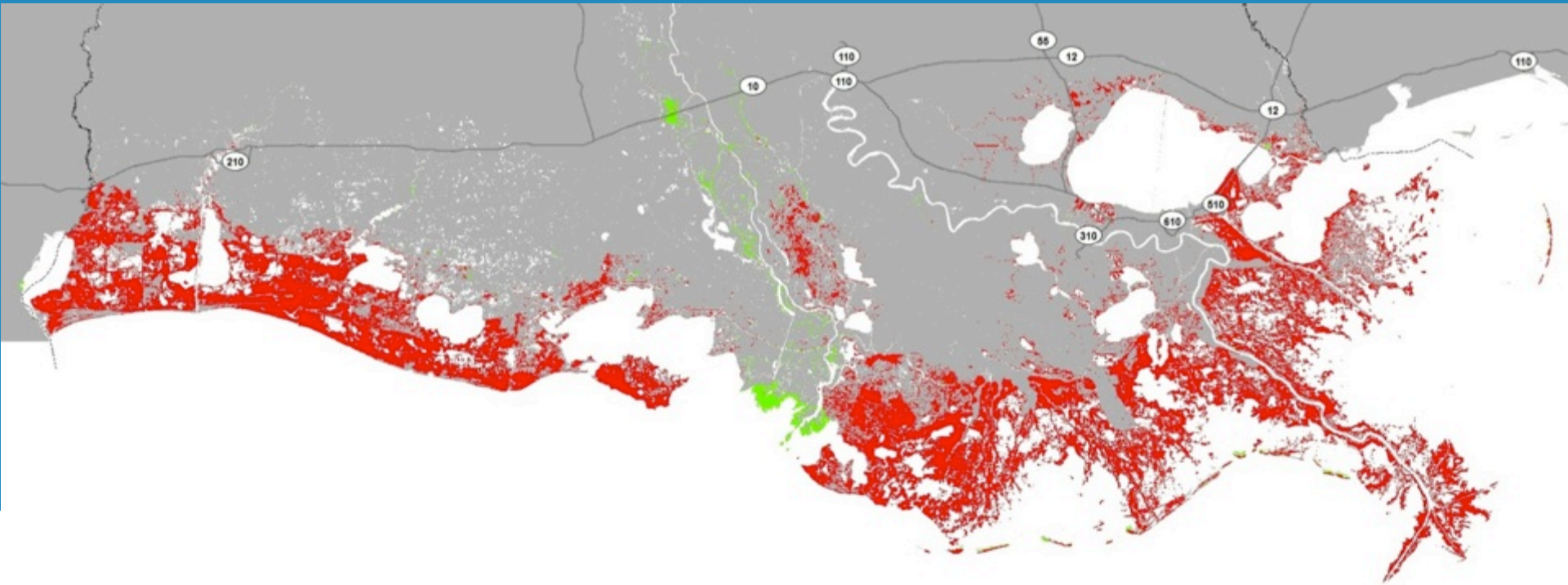
2017 Master Plan New Project Development Program

- **Screening Criteria:** Like the 2012 plan, a screening process will be used to determine whether a project has the potential to be included in the 2017 analysis
 - Screening Criteria will include:
 - Size Threshold
 - Geographic Area
 - Consistency with Master Plan Objectives and Principles
 - Duplicative Effects

2017 Master Plan New Project Development Program

- Submittal Details

- All proposals must be delivered electronically, in .pdf format, to MasterPlan@la.gov by October 31, 2014
- Proposals should be no more than 7 pages (1-2 pages for Cover Sheet and Contact Information, 2 pages for Project Description, 1 page for a Map, and 1-2 pages for Project Attributes)

- CPRA staff will be available to help develop and refine project attributes
