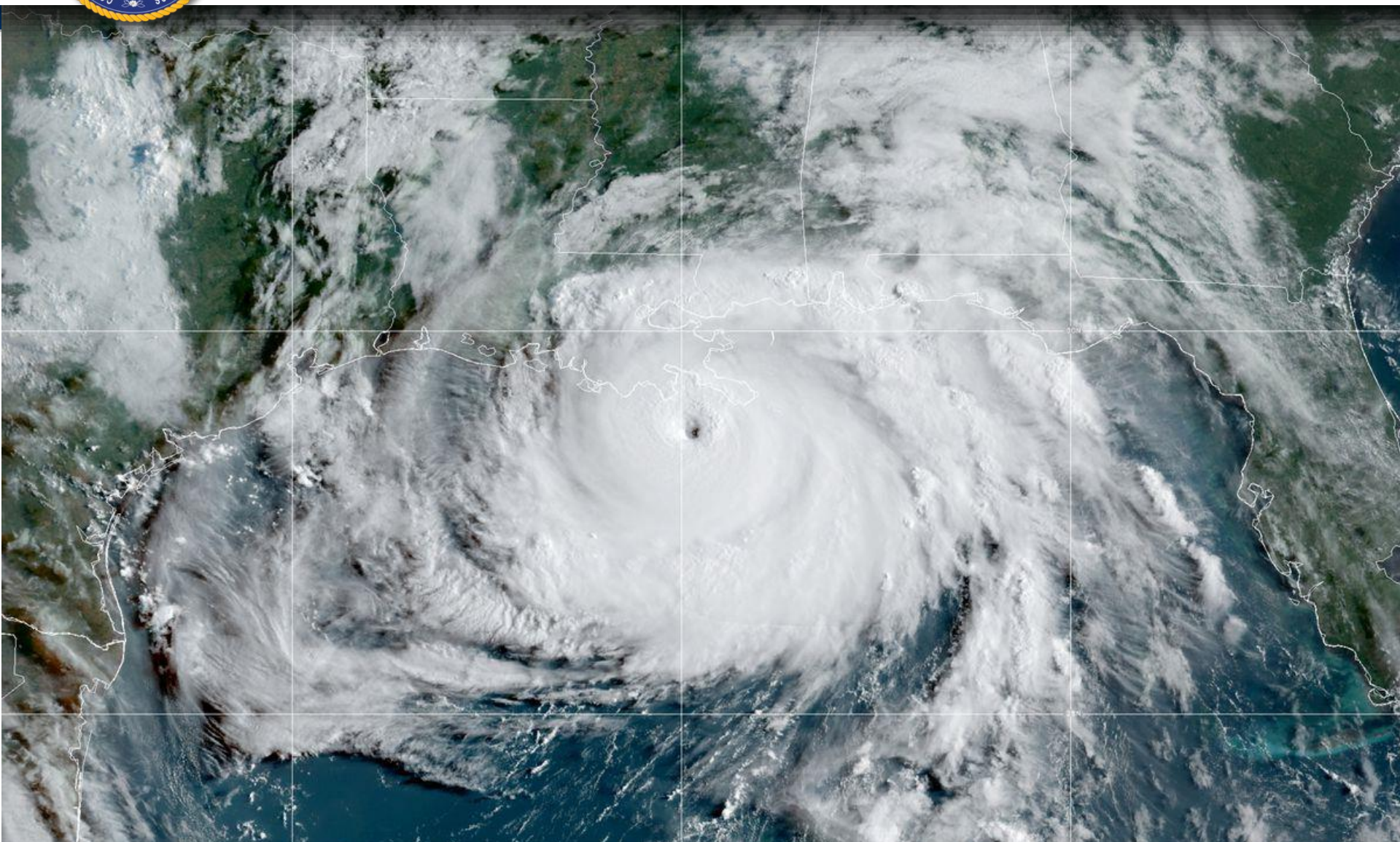

FY 2022 FMA Swift Current

- Louisiana Allocation: \$40M (\$36M set aside for project cost)
- LA Priorities:
 - ▶ Ida impacted parishes
 - ▶ Substantially Damaged (SD) properties (with an SD determination made after 8/26/21) with CDC SVI of 0.5001
 - ▶ Severe Repetitive Loss (SRL), and Repetitive Loss (RL) properties (priority given to those also meeting CDC SVI criteria)
 - ▶ SD properties not meeting the CDC SVI criteria
- All properties must have had current NFIP policy in effect by 4/1/22.
- 2 Subapplication Rounds with due dates of May 23rd and June 30th.



STORM Act

- **Safeguarding Tomorrow through Ongoing Risk Mitigation Act or the STORM Act:** Bill authorizes the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to enter into agreements with any state or Indian tribal government to make capitalization grants for the establishment of hazard mitigation revolving loan funds.
- **Louisiana HB 1052:** Proposed law establishes the Hazard Mitigation Revolving Loan Fund to be administered by GOHSEP, for the purpose of providing financial assistance to local government hazard mitigation projects.
- FEMA HQ is working on the framework for the program, anticipates implementation in **late 2023**.
